What is the TASK Program?

The Trades Awareness Skills and Knowledge (TASK) Program is offered in partnership with Camosun College. TASK exposes interested students to various construction and mechanical trades as they explore units in carpentry, electrical, plumbing, and metal trades. Work Experience is also a key component of the TASK Program and gives students an opportunity to develop employability skills which may lead to a paid job and/or an apprenticeship.

Where is the Program?

Construction TASK is located at Royal Bay Secondary School and runs in both Semester 1 and 2.

Metal TASK takes place at Edward Milne Community School and is only offered in Semester 1.

TASK Programs are one full semester in length.

What skills are covered in TASK?

TASK is a hands-on program that focuses on four trade areas: carpentry, metal, electrical and plumbing. Students will get practical experience building a variety of projects such as: saw horses, picnic tables and sheds. Upon successful completion of the TASK Program, students will receive Industry Training Authority (ITA) C.O.R.E. certification from Camosun College.

To ensure students are job ready, they will also take entry-level industry certification courses such as:

- First Aid
- Scissor Lift Operator
- WHIMIS
- Fall Arrest
- Confined Spaces Entry



Student Profile

This program is available for students in grade 11 or 12 who:

- have a high degree of commitment and maturity.
- have a good school attendance record.
- are self-motivated along with a willingness and ability to plan and work independently.
- have the ability to work as part of a team.
- are interested in pursuing a pathway in the trades.

Course Credits

Students will earn 16-20 high school credits: Math, Woodwork, Work Experience, as well as TST-A and TST-B, which are dual credit college courses in partnership with Camosun College and the South Island Partnership.

Students who go on to enroll in Youth Work in Trades may earn up to 16 additional high school credits and be eligible for a \$1000 award.
